


FOOD PANTRY DONATIONS NEEDED! DEMAND IS GROWING


Hearts and Hands of St. Joseph

What's one part of your role that brings you joy? What brings me the most joy in my role as a business manager at our parish is knowing that the work I do—whether it's balancing budgets, coordinating operations, planning for our facilities, —is helping to build a stronger, more vibrant faith community. I love that I get to support both the spiritual and practical sides of parish life.

Do you have any advice for someone becoming part of our parish community?

Get involved. Whether it's joining a ministry, volunteering, or simply showing up to parish events, there's something transformative about being part of the life of the community. When you engage with others, you begin to see Christ reflected in their kindness, their stories, and their service. It's in those moments of connection that faith deepens and belonging grows. Don't be afraid to take that first step—our parish is richer because of every person who chooses to be part of it.

If you could have dinner with any saint, who would it be and what would you ask them?

St. Jude, the patron saint of lost causes. His devotion is rooted in the belief that even when all seems lost, God can still work miracles. I would ask him what moment in his life first convinced him that God's power is strongest when hope seems gone.

What's something people might not know about your job? Behind the scenes, I work closely with donors to create scholarships that open doors for students who might not otherwise have access. I help families navigate estate planning, ensuring their values and generosity continue to shape our community long after they're gone. These conversations are deeply personal, rooted in trust and shared purpose. They're not just about numbers—they're about legacy, compassion, and faith in action. It's an honor to witness those moments when stewardship becomes a living story, and generosity sparks real transformation.


