
This weekend, the flowers on the Main Altar are in celebration of the kickoff of the 75th Anniversary of St. Joseph Catholic Church.

Upcoming Second Collection (10/21-22) World Mission Sunday



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

World Mission Sunday will be celebrated on Sunday, Oct. 22, and Pope Francis asks all of us to focus not on the country in which we live, but on the mission fields of our world. Why? Because there are 258,540 religious sisters laboring there; 844,000 catechists teaching the faith to the world's villages; 38,140 seminarians studying for the priesthood; 8,750 shelters serving the homeless; and 26 million children receiving necessary assistance.

Pope Francis has sent a call to each of us to go into our world and proclaim the presence of Christ, to make his love visible and real through missionary work that reaches to the ends of the earth. He said all of us "can contribute to this missionary movement with our prayers and activities, with material offerings and the offering of our sufferings, and our personal witness.

"Just as the two disciples of Emmaus told the others what had taken place along the way (cf. Lk 24:35), so too our proclamation will be a joyful telling of Christ the Lord, his life, his passion, his death and resurrection, and the wonders that his love has accomplished in our lives," the pope said.

Missio ad Gentes, the Vatican II document on the missionary nature of the Church, reminds us that the Church of Christ is a missionary Church, that the human family has a right to hear the good news of peace and salvation, and our God is Emmanuel. The Pontifical Societies for the Propagation of the Faith has the primary responsibility for the Church's missionary work. In the Diocese of Charleston, it is under the leadership of Rev. Msgr. Edward D. Lofton, director, and Helena Moniz, associate director. The office is available to assist each of you. I thank you for the generous support you give to the Church's missions.

FROM THE ORGAN BENCH NO. 11 OF 14

Go to <u>www.stjosephcolumbia.org/sacred-musicministry</u> for *From the Organ Bench* Articles 1-10. How long would it take to build a pipe organ? Pipe organs are made of thousands of highly specialized components. The instrument our organ committee would like to see built, God willing, would contain almost 4,000 pipes, some as small as a pencil, some so large that five 6' tall people could stand inside the pipe one on top of the other! The pipes and thousands of other components must be hand-crafted by highly trained craftsmen.

If God makes a way for a specification and visual design to be settled on and a contract signed, the Fisk Co. would create a 1/16 scale model of the St. Joseph Church interior with the organ built into the model. Fisk is the only organ builder in the world that takes this extra step. Creating a scale model takes about three months. Once the scale model is completed, the organ committee, church leadership, and/or anyone with a special interest in the project visits the builder to inspect the model. The scale model is amazing. The model sits on a raised platform making it possible for any average-height individual to walk up and rest their chin on the floor of the model. It is as if you are stepping into the church and seeing the organ in its actual environment, to scale. All of the interior features of the church, pews, paint color, columns, ceiling rafters, windows, *everything* is meticulously detailed in the model. This enables decisions to be made regarding any changes that might need to be made in the placement or visual design of the organ. Once the model is approved, it would take about 12-15 months to build the organ.
