

SPECIAL NEEDS:

Special needs and wheelchair seating is available in the front row of the Church. Cars must display a valid handicap sticker to park in the reserved handicap spaces in the Church parking lot. There are 12 reserved spaces for seniors on Sundays only (from 8 AM -10:30 AM), in the Ministries and Administration Building parking lot.

REMINDER

- Canopy and restroom construction to start Tuesday, June 1st.
- Weekend Masses, weddings, funerals and baptisms will continue in the church.
- Weekday Masses will be in the gymnasium.
- We will temporarily suspend Exposition, Adoration and Benediction in the church.
- The church will continue to be open for private prayer.
- Since we do not have the same technology in the gymnasium as we do for the church, we will no longer be able to livestream the daily Masses.

For weekend Masses, everyone will need to enter and exit the church using the main entrance on Devine Street or the entrances on the courtyard side, where there is a handicap ramp nearest the fountain. All entrances on Bonham Street will be inaccessible for safety concerns. Since we are constructing new handicap assessable restrooms, the two current restrooms will be not be available for weekend Masses. The restrooms in the gymnasium will be available, but children should not be sent to the restrooms unaccompanied. We will be designating the parking lot in front of the school as a handicap lot during Masses. The handicap lot on Bonham Street, directly next to the church, will be closed for the duration of the project, as that area is where the construction will be staged.

As such, please plan to arrive for Mass and other events sufficiently early to allow time to park, visit restrooms, if necessary and enter the church by these alternate entrances. I also ask you to be considerate of those that are less mobile and leave available to them both the handicapped parking spaces that will be provided in the school's front parking lot, as well as the street parking spaces nearest the opened entrances.

My Dear St. Joseph Parishioners,

Bishop Robert Guglielmone has announced that starting with the Saturday Vigil Mass on June 5, 2021, the Feast of Corpus Christi, the general dispensation from attending Mass will be lifted. This ends the general dispensation from the requirement to attend Sunday Masses and Holy Days, which was granted in 2020 because of the pandemic.

Beginning that weekend, all Catholics in South Carolina will once again be bound to the moral duty of attending Sunday Mass, except for those who are ill or at special risk of grave illness from Covid-19 by reason of age, or underlying health conditions. They are still exempt from the necessity of attending Mass in person, but everyone else must return to regular Mass attendance each Sunday to fulfill the commandment of keeping holy the Lord's Day.

Masks remain recommended for everyone who has not been vaccinated, and Bishop Guglielmone also urges every Catholic who is twelve years of age or older to be vaccinated as soon as possible to have the best possible protection against serious illness for themselves and their neighbors. The text of our bishop's letter is attached to this email.

Please note the current CDC guidelines:

• Fully vaccinated people can resume activities without wearing a mask or physically distancing, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance.

Below is some additional information you will find helpful:


- Masks will remain an option for those who choose. Masks remain recommended for those who have not been vaccinated, or who are still uncomfortable in large crowds. The Bishop encourages vaccination for those who haven't received one.
- Starting June 5th, the Feast of Corpus Christi, the church will be back to full capacity.
- There will be no spacing requirements in the church.
- Parishioners will still be greeted by those in our Greeter Ministry but are able to seat themselves in the pews.
- The dispensers of sanitizer will be moved from the center aisle but will remain at the side entrances and in the back of the church. Parishioners are encouraged to bring their own individual containers to use as needed.
- The church doors will open 45 minutes prior to Mass. On Saturdays, the church will open at 3:15 p.m. for Confessions. On Sundays, the church will open at 7:15 a.m.
- We will continue to simulcast into the gymnasium for the 10:30 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. Masses for overflow and for those who prefer to socially distance, but not for the 5:30 p.m. Saturday Vigil, nor the 8:00 a.m. Sunday morning Mass.
- We will continue to broadcast the 10:30 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. Masses for those who are unable to attend Mass, as well as simulcast to the gymnasium for those who wish to be in the gymnasium.
- To maintain a sacred atmosphere for those viewing from home, we ask that those in the church and narthex be especially quiet as the broadcast microphones are extremely sensitive and are spaced throughout the church for optimum sound quality.
- The Bishop has stated that all protocols are left to the discretion of the Pastor, except offering the chalice at communion and the exchange of the Sign of Peace will remain suppressed.

- The restrooms in the church will be closed during our construction project, effective June 1st. Restrooms in the Rowland Building will be available.
- Children should be accompanied to the restrooms, as the restrooms are not in the church.
- Due to construction, the cry room will not be available during Masses.
- For safety reasons and the noise created due to construction, weekday Masses will be in the gymnasium and we will temporarily suspend Exposition, Adoration, and Benediction in the church. Since we do not have the technological capabilities in the gym to simulcast those Masses to the homebound, the daily Masses will no longer be broadcast to our YouTube channel.
- The church will continue to be open for private prayer 8:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m., Monday-Friday.

Our journey together during this difficult time has been trying and, at times almost surreal, but you have continued to support me, my staff, and our volunteers, and done so with patience and understanding. For this, I thank you and all those who have offered your prayers and faithfulness to us and the parish. May the Lord continue to unite, bless, and keep each of us and your loved ones safe as together we return to the Table of the Lord

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The time will soon come when we may return to public worship without fear of the coronavirus, and so effective June 5, when we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will end.

Individual dispensation, for those who are still at risk of grave illness and for their caretakers, will remain in place. These include but are not limited to caring for the sick, homebound, or infirm, those who exhibit flu-like symptoms or who are in the high-risk category.

We closed our churches and schools in March 2020 because it was the responsible thing to do, and it was important to follow local, state, and national health ordinances. We were able to resume public worship with safety precautions in place in May, and our Catholic schools opened for in-person instruction in the fall. We have learned how to live with this virus and to find a way through it together.

I am grateful to all of you for the patience and generosity you demonstrated during this difficult year, and it is our goal to make public worship accessible to everyone while still providing options for distancing and safety. Because we will be dealing with it for many years to come, it is important for everyone 12 year of age or older receive the vaccinations which are now available, both for the health of our communities and our shared life in the faith. It is not sinful in any way to receive any of the three COVID-19 vaccines.

As Catholics, we attend Mass to gather as a community that believes in Christ Jesus, and especially to receive our Lord in the Most Holy Eucharist. It is the source and summit of the Christian faith and life. I pray that you and your family will be restored and nourished by returning to the Table of the Lord.

Please pray for your priests who have worked so diligently throughout this pandemic and know that my prayers remain with you and your families.

MUSICAM SACRAM Evolution of Sacred Music: Harmony and Polyphony

The exploration of harmony and the emergence of polyphony is known as a 'transitional' time in sacred music. Polyphony, or a compositional style where multiple melody lines are being sung at one time in harmony with each other, is most commonly associated with the Renaissance period of music (1400-1600). However, the earliest exploration of polyphony is credited to the Notre-Dame school of polyphony-directly referring to a group of composers working at the Notre-Dame Cathedral in Paris between 1160-1250. Of those composers, the most well-known is Léonin, who is attributed with developing rhythmic modes and notational patterns that allowed for written music to communicate concrete timing (or rhythm). Léonin's compositional techniques pushed the boundaries and expanded on organum techniques that were discussed in my previous article, "Evolution of Sacred Music: Harmonies Emerge" found on the Sacred Music page on our website - www.stjosephcolumbia.org/sacred-music-ministry. With the ability to notate duration of chant melodies, the door was open for composers to write music for multiple singers to sing separate melodic lines at the same time making beautiful harmonies. Léonin is considered to be the father of the music for four voices.

To hear what the music during liturgy may have sounded like in the 12th-century, type "Leonin- Messe du Jour de Noel (Ensemble Organum)" into YouTube.


THE WILD GOOSE: GOD'S LOVE POURED OUT
