Our Lady's Rosary Makers thank the Women's Society for their support of our Ministry. We have completed our first full year as a ministry and would like to share with you where the rosaries have gone, as well as our expenses and donations.

We have made and distributed a total of **8,580** rosaries in 2022.

155 went to the Columbarium and Adoration Chapel at St. Joseph's

105 went to miscellaneous areas such as Box of Joy, School children etc.

470 went to Father Frei. He takes them to the Sisters of Charity in Charlotte, Hospital visits, USC Student center etc.

1.350 went to Fort Jackson for the Recruits

6,500 were sent around the world – Africa, India, Cameroon, Philippines, Venezuela to name a few.

Our expenses for supplies were \$1,277.00 and expense for postage was \$364.00. Total Expense \$1,655 Donations for 2022

\$935.00 from the Rosary Makers, \$200.00 from Anonymous, \$60.00 from friends of the Rosary Makers, \$300.00 from the St. Joseph Women's Society. Total Donation - \$1,495.00.

NOTE: We did have a \$155.00 balance from 2021, so we ended 2022 with \$9.00 in the account.

All about Mary "Our Lady of Good Success"

In the 1600's Our Lady appeared to a Conceptionist sister, Mother Marianna de Jesus Torres in Quito, Ecuador. Our Lady greeted her saying: "I am Mary of Good Success, the one whom you have invoked with such tender affection. Your prayer has greatly pleased. Your faith has brought me here. You love invited me to visit you." Our Lady stated that it was Her wish to be made known to the Conceptionist Convent in Quito and the rest of the world as "Our Lady of Good Success". She foretold that the church would be in a state of crisis in the Twentieth Century. Our Lady asked Mother Mariana to be a victim soul for this particular time.

Venerable Mother Mariana de Jesus Torres witnessed multiple heavenly visitors and was a recipient of the stigmata in addition to her reception of Our Lady of Good Success. Over the course of forty years Our Lady appeared to Mother Marianna a total of four times. Her first appearance was on February 2, 1594.

Throughout the decades, she prophesied on many things to come, including the declaration of the dogma of the Immaculate Conception, local events in Ecuador like the election and martyrdom of a truly Christion president, and a decline of faith among the people around the world including priests and religious.

This apparition was approved on February 2, 1611 by Bishop Salvador de Riber before the final appearance occurred on December 8, 1634.
