The First Saturday Centennial & Virtual Pilgrimage
On December 10, 2025, we celebrated the 100th
anniversary of Our Lord and Lady's request in
Pontevedre, Spain, for the First Saturday Devotion. It is a
call to make reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary
for these 5 offenses: blasphemies against her Immaculate
Conception, her perpetual virginity, her motherhood,
for those who keep children from Mary, and for those
who insult Our Lady in her sacred images. Our Lord
wants His Mother honored for all she suffered for Him
and with Him.

To fulfill this request, one does the following on the First Saturday of each month:


- 1) Receive Holy Communion on the First Saturday.
- 2) Go to Confession on the First Saturday or 8 days before or after the First Saturday.
- 3) Pray 5 decades of the Rosary.
- 4) Keep Our Lady company for 15 minutes while reflecting on one of the mysteries of the Rosary.


Each of the above is done with the intention of making reparation to Our Lady for the blasphemies and ingratitude against her. In return, Our Lady promises peace in the world and to each person who practices this devotion, her assistance at the hour of death with the graces necessary for salvation.
