
















# Columbia Deanery Report St.Joseph Women's Society January 1, 2023 – May 15, 2023

- ➤ Our members continue to participate in a number of ministries:
  - An outreach ministry called "Smile Kits". Monthly, 20 members sent cards and or emails to other members who are not able to attend a meeting or recovering from illness, etc.
  - Many members continue to be signed up with Birthright Prayer Warriors. We receive we receive frequent emails from Birthright with specific prayer requests for mothers-to-be who are struggling physically or emotionally with their pregnancies or other circumstances. We pray for them for God to guide them through to solutions for their families.
  - Masses were requested for deceased family members and SJWS members who have died.
  - ➤ Our "Food for the Bereaved" continues. We have three groups of ladies who take turns providing for this ministry. Funerals are followed by a lunch or refreshment reception, in Donor Hall of our Ministries Building. In cooperation with Monsignor and staff, we provide, in many cases, the meal itself. We also set up, serve, and clean up, in order for the families to have that quality time with extended family. If preferred, the meal is delivered to the home of a family member instead. We have three groups of ladies who take turns providing for this ministry.

Presently, we have a committee embarking on expansion of our Bereavement 'program'. We hope to add parishioners who are not necessarily members of our Affiliate. We hope to establish a fourth group, and enlarge the existing three groups.

- ➤ We followed Legislative activity through the email promptings from the Diocese of Charleston. Our Legislative Chairwoman keeps us abreast of time sensitive issues.
- ➤ The SJWS continues to have members serving on the Affiliate, Deanery and State levels, fulfilling the duties in various offices or commissions.
- ➤ Our members clean the church weekly and also wash and press the altar linens. We either replace worn altar linens, or one of our members, who sews, makes the new linens.
- > Several members participate in the parish rosary making ministry. At least annually, we make a monetary gift to help defray their cost of shipping and/or to replenish the guild's supplies. We attribute this to our international outreach.
- ➤ Quite a few members volunteer at Clean of Heart. We support our Sisters and the staff at Clean of Heart with collection drives for their clients' needs. We just began collecting items needed especially due to the hot weather.
- ➤ Other members also volunteer at Birthright, and the St Vincent de Paul Pantry. Some serve as Eucharistic Ministers and Lectors, and participate in Adoration.
- > Several members serve the Bereaved by assisting at funeral Masses. We are purchasing a new pall for the parish as soon as Monsignor makes the selection.

#### As a body, we were very active also:

This past January, we held our Annual Meeting and Luncheon. We centered our focus on our Diocese of Charleston Seminarians, and invited Seminarian Daniel Perry to be our Guest

- Speaker. We also invited our Youth to help us as greeters, table escorts and dessert servers. A part of the luncheon ticket fee was allocated as gift to the Diocesan Vocations Office, and given for use to fulfill Seminarians' needs. We were able to donate \$400.00
- Nine of our members attended the SCCCW Annual Convention in Myrtle Beach, SC. Our Affiliate's Catholic Woman of the Year, Martha Faller Becht, who went on to be named the Columbia Deanery CWOY, was named as the SCCCW Catholic Woman of the Year.
- ➤ We collected items for Catholic Charities Clean of Heart at our February meeting, which was themed "Share the Love" A large quantity of much needed items was collected. As well, donations of gift cards were given.
- For Lent, we hosted a Retreat on a Sunday afternoon, and invited the women of the parish. The Retreat, led by Sr. Mary Cecile Swanton, was entitled "Joy Comes with the Dawn (A Catholic Perspective on Suffering and Pain). It was well attended and enjoyed by all there.
- ➤ Also during Lent, we, we took our turn and hosted the "Soup Supper" for the Parish on March 31. Various meatless soups, breads and drinks were provided and served. Quite a few of our members cooked, set up, served and cleaned up.
- As is tradition, our members decorate the Church for Easter.
- ➤ On May 7, we honored our Blessed Mother. We attended Mass together, and then, led by Monsignor Harris, processed to the Rose Garden for a prayer service which included the Crowning of the Statue Image of Our Lady. Our SC Catholic Woman of the Year, Martha Becht, held the honor of crowning Her. We invited all members of the Parish. A total of approximately 100 attended, including several First Communicants.
- > Two members hosted a reception for scholarship recipients and their families. These students attend St. Joseph School.
- ➤ We distributed funds raised this past year. The Outreach donations, totaling \$ 2,500, were made both locally, and internationally. We supported Mr. Jerry White, who is a Deaconate Candidate, and is a member of our Parish. Also we sent gifts to St. Clare's Home in Greenville, SC, Lighthouse for Life, in Columbia, SC, and to the late Msgr. J. Donald Gorski's longtime Mission in Zorritos, Peru.
- ➤ We are currently collecting specific items for Catholic Charities-Clean of Heart, dropping off at the Parish Office. This effort includes toiletries, small canned foods, and certain clothing.
- > We've completed some "housekeeping items", to include an inventory of our linens, an updating of our Telephone Tree.

We look forward to summer events and returning to a regular schedule in the fall.
