

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This month in Via Fidelis, we turn our focus to seeing the face of God in our neighbors. Sometimes, we get caught up in the day-to-day rush and forget that, despite how we are feeling in the moment, everyone deserves respect as living images of our Creator.

Christ called us to spread the Gospel in every aspect of our lives — not just at church, but at home, at work, and in our daily interactions. The fullness of the Good News culminates in Christ's sacrifice on the cross, where he taught us truly how to love one another. "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you" (Jn 15:12). Once we live this instruction, our lives become a testimony to the kerygma.

We may find the love of Jesus in every part of God's creation and must especially see that love in our brothers and sisters. Let us focus on recognizing the face of Christ in everyone we meet this month so we may serve them with love, joy and humility. This might mean offering patient words to someone who frustrates us, showing kindness to a worker at a drive-thru, or reaching out to someone who is lonely.

November is dedicated to the saints and the departed faithful. We know that Christ's salvation was offered once and to all, so we pray for those who have gone before us. Their salvation is at hand, and our prayers support their journey to eternal life with God. We are not separated by death from those whom we love.

I encourage you to participate in Mass celebrations, to pray the rosary and to perform acts of charity. What a beautiful gift we can offer through our prayers, and may our understanding of and love for the Gospel bring us and others to everlasting life. As we do these things as a diocese, and continue our personal and parish activities, we will make an indelible mark in South Carolina.

Thank you for answering the call to become disciples of the Lord and seeing his face in the people and the world around you.

How long have you been part of the parish/staff?

Tell us a little about your background (family, education, previous work): Born in Florence, South Carolina, I grew up in a musical family (mother,a classical organist and longtime music educator; father, a bluegrass musician) and played classical violin as well as with my father's bluegrass band, while singing in choirs throughout elementary and high school. I moved to Columbia in 2014 to study at the University of South Carolina, earning a B.M. in Music Education and Violin Performance, an M.M. in Violin/Viola Pedagogy (2021), and an M.Ed. in Educational Administration (2023). I completed coursework for the M.M. in Choral Conducting and am pursuing the DMA in Violin Performance. I also lived in Ireland, where I completed a Level 8 Honours Certification in Irish Cultural Heritage at the National University of Ireland. Before joining St. Joseph, I directed music at Trinity UMC in Sumter for many years. I am now proud to serve as Director of Music at St. Joseph Catholic Church and as Adjunct Professor of Violin at Columbia College, following prior roles teaching orchestra and chorus and serving as Related Arts Department Chair at schools in Richland and Lexington School District

What's one part of your role that brings you joy?

I have so many things I love about my job here – the staff members, the parish community, the choir members, etc. If I had to choose one thing, though, it would be getting to conduct the choral anthems I have picked each Sunday! I spend a LOT of time reading through weekly scriptures, trying to find the best anthem that fits the theme of each Sunday. Being able to elevate someone's worship experience through music is so rewarding for me. It makes the late nights leaving the office at 10 pm worth every bit of it!

What advice would you give to someone just joining our parish? Get involved! There are SO many options for people to get involved with different Ministries here (like singing in the choir!!) It starts with being brave enough to ask for information or to take that first step to prioritize showing up to a meeting or bible study. All of our email information for

Ministry contacts is available on the website, so please reach out!


If you could have dinner with any saint, who would it be and what would you ask them? I would have a meal with Saint Ciarán of Clonmacnoise. He is my Confirmation Saint and one of the first Saints I ever learned about when I lived in Ireland before I converted to Catholicism. He started me down my Faith Journey years ago, and having seen where he lived and learned about his life through my Archaeology and Literary degree there, I'd love to hear his side of the story!

What's something people might not know about your job?

Apart from coordinating ALL of the music that takes place at St. Joseph, I also make sure that every Funeral, Wedding, special Mass, and weekend Mass (all 4 of the Masses each weekend), have a Cantor scheduled to be there to sing the Introit, Responsorial Psalms, Gospel Acclamation, Offertory, and Communion Propers! The real fun comes when someone calls in sick the morning of or forgets they were scheduled to Cantor! Luckily, I am very organized and stay scheduled out 4 months ahead!

Favorite hymn: Since I am the Choir Director, I am breaking the rules and going to give my favorite Choral Piece – Requiem Op. 6 – by Maurice Durufle (we are doing parts of this for the Annual Mass of Remembrance in November!)

Favorite church season (Advent, Lent, etc.): Advent-Christmas: Some of my favorite choral anthems to program usually fall during this time!
