OUR LADY OF GOOD COUNSEL

Patroness of the National Council of Catholic Women Feast Day – April 26th Contributed by Mary Bettin

Since we have Our Lady of Good Council, I was curious to know about her. In my research I found her legacy all began back in April of 1467 in Genazzano, a city about 30 miles SE of Rome. The church there named "Our Mother of Good Counsel" was being renovated, and on April 25th, as a side wall was being repaired, a marble figure of the Madonna was removed. Suddenly they heard beautiful music, saw a mysterious cloud descend and as the cloud dissipated a beautiful fresco of the Virgin Mary and Child appeared where the Madonna had been removed. It was on a thin layer of porcelain, no thicker than an egg shell, and approximately 16x18". They immediately named the image after their church. A vast number of miracles are said to have been performed at the site of this portrait. It is believed this fresco was miraculously transported from a church in Albania. The church in Albania was being threatened by Ottoman Turkish invaders at that time. The amazing fact is, this picture was so thin and delicate, it could not have been transported intact by any normal means.

Many Popes have made pilgrimages to this site. In November, Pope Innocent XI had the picture solemnly crowned. In 1939, Venerable Pope Pius XII placed his pontificate under the maternal care of Our Lady of Good Counsel and composed a prayer to her.

"Most Glorious Virgin, chosen by the Eternal Counsel to be the Mother of the Eternal Word made flesh, thou who art the treasurer of Divine graces, and the advocate of sinners, I, thy most unworthy servant, have recourse to thee; be thou pleased to be my guide and counselor in this vale of tears. Obtain for me through the Most Precious Blood of the Divine Son, the forgiveness of my sins, the salvation of my soul, and the means necessary to obtain it. In like manner, obtain for Holy Mother the Church victory over her enemies, and the spread of the kingdom of Jesus Christ upon the whole earth." Amen.

The fresco is still there, having survived earthquakes over the centuries and bombardment in World War II, which destroyed much of the church.

Remember, Our Blessed Mother is ready, willing and more than able to help us in the midst of this world's strife. We need to approach her for assistance in drawing closer to Jesus with fervent, humble prayer and devotion. Pope Pius V credited Our Lady of Good Counsel with helping the Holy League of forces from Catholic maritime states defeat the Muslim Ottoman Empire in the Battle of Lepanto in 1571.

Our Lady of Good Counsel, Pray for us.
