

HEARING LOOP IN THE SANCTUARY:

In order to access the Loop, a hearing aid must be programmed for the "T" setting, which can be done by a hearing aid specialist. When in the Church, the user can go to the "T" setting on their device and will be connected to the speaker system via their hearing aid.

APRIL IS NATIONAL CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH

As a nation, we dedicate the month of April to raise awareness about the prevention of child abuse. Abuse of any kind is contrary to the teachings of the Catholic faith, but the abuse of a child or a vulnerable adult is recognized as particularly egregious due to the long-term negative impact on spiritual, psychological, social, and physical development. The Diocese of Charleston reaffirms our commitment to remain vigilant in our efforts to prevent abuse in our families and faith communities. As we go about our daily lives in our parishes and schools, it can be difficult to see that our Safe Environment efforts are about more than compliance with the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, our diocesan policies and procedures, and risk management. It is easy to get stuck in the "checkbox mentality" or the mindset that "I didn't abuse anybody so why should I have to jump through all these hoops?" Sometimes the requirements of our safe environment policies and procedures can seem intrusive, uncomfortable, or simply a waste of time. However, our efforts are about who we are and are the fruit of our way of being in community. What happens to you, my brother or sister, happens to me. What happens to your child, happens to me. As the Body of Christ, when one of us hurts, we all hurt. This month, in honor of National Child Abuse Prevention Month, let's challenge ourselves to not only view our Safe Environment efforts through the lens of our faith but to truly live it as well. Let's view them as an opportunity for us to care for the needs of others as Christ taught us. Remember His words, "Whatever you do for the least of my brothers, you do for me."



POSITIONS AVAILABLE

Part-time Director of Communications

Responsibilities include managing external communications, such as school website, social media, and advertising; assist the principal in communicating internally with staff and school families; develop special projects like photo and video shoots, commercials, and promotional items; involved in planning, tracking, and collecting for the Annual Fund and PTO sponsorships; part of the school administration team.

Ideal candidates should possess strong writing, copy-editing, and organizational skills across multiple platforms and an understanding of digital marketing campaigns and website content design. Preferred applicants will have previous experience in communications, marketing, or development. The position hours will be between 20 and 30 hours a week.

Director of Extended Care

Responsibilities include supervising the daily Extended Care program for 180 school days in addition to the ten professional development and selected no-school days from August – June. The position will also oversee the Christmas and Summer Camp programs. The individual is responsible for hiring and managing the Extended Care staff and Assistant Director for all sessions. The individual will work with the school's Bookkeeper on monthly billing and ordering snacks and supplies. Preferred applicants will have previous teaching or childcare experience.

Elementary Teacher

The selected applicants will develop dynamic lessons, class projects, and activities that enhance the student's academic, social, and spiritual needs and fulfill and exceed the South Carolina and Diocese academic standards.

Applicants should have an understanding of the Catholic faith and be able to incorporate lessons that uphold and build upon the school's mission. Preferred applicants will have a current South Carolina license or equivalent license and demonstrate previous teaching experience.

Instructional Assistant

The position's responsibilities include providing classroom support to the students and helping the lead teacher develop dynamic lessons, class projects and activities that enhance the student's academic, social, and spiritual needs. The selected applicant will run a small group learning station under the supervision of the lead teacher. The position will supervise lunch and or recess duty daily. In addition, the position also has a variety of clerical activities and related tasks to support the teacher and students.

Applicants should have an understanding of the Catholic faith and be able to build a program that upholds and builds upon the school's mission.






