

HEARING LOOP IN THE SANCTUARY:



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, Nov. 18 is World Day for the Prevention of and Healing from Child Sexual Exploitation, Abuse, and Violence. I would like to take this opportunity to discuss this painful issue that is too often avoided in discussion.

We recall Christ's words from the Gospel of Matthew, "Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these" (19:14). Each of us has a duty to protect these little ones at all costs. This involves being vigilant to those under our care, knowing where and who they are in the presence of at all times. It also means speaking up when their safety and privacy have been or could be violated.

This is an obligation, not merely a suggestion. The scars of abuse run deep, and their devastating effects are present for the rest of the lives of victims. Those who have suffered child abuse require careful, attentive, and patient ministry. Where their dignity and trust have been disregarded, an outpouring of grace is vital.

Brother priests and consecrated men and women of our diocese, you have been placed in a unique situation to make the sacraments and counseling resources available to these children: act immediately to expand these offerings in your home parishes.

All lay brothers and sisters, you participate in family life and play a crucial role in the upbringing of these little ones. Please, keep each other accountable, and watch over your children with intentionality and diligence.

I pray for the safety of children throughout the world, especially those who are currently in a dangerous situation, and for those who have already suffered abuse. Let us work tirelessly to eradicate this real and present scourge in our communities, in our state, country, and world. If you know of a situation in which a child is in danger, I urge you to contact law enforcement immediately.





Remarkably, her tragedy transformed Immaculée into a strong woman dedicated to peace and reconciliation. She now travels the world sharing her story and healing the hearts of those struggling with fear, doubt, and hate. Her autobiography, Left to Tell, has sold more than two million copies and is in the process of becoming a major motion picture. 
