Are you looking for a unique way to rejuvenate your spiritual health?

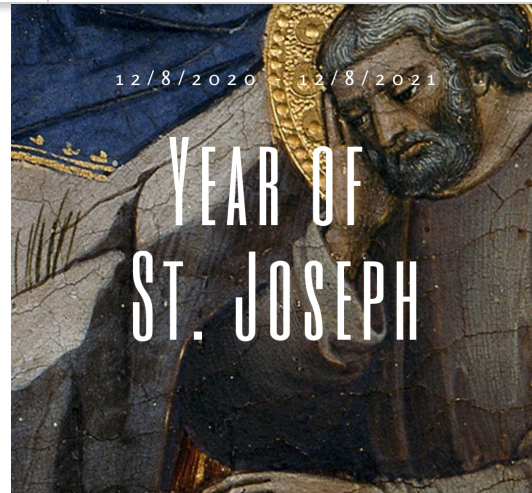
