#### From the Organ Bench

The two choral anthems today were composed by Virgil Thomson and Richard Farrant.

Thomson, a major figure in 20th century American music, studied at Harvard University and later lived in Paris from 1925-1940 where he was greatly influenced by several French composers and teachers, including Nadia Boulanger. Upon returning to the US, he settled in New York City and inspired a new generation of composers. He was awarded the Pulitzer Prize in Music in 1949.

Born centuries earlier in Renaissance England, Farrant was not only a composer and choirmaster, but he was also active in stage and founded the original Blackfriars Theater. He also was an excellent organist and served three monarchs: Edward VI, Mary I, and Elizebeth I. The organ variations heard today are based upon the Lenten tune "Heinlein" and were composed in a Baroque style by Christa Rakich, former organist at Harvard University and currently a member of the organ faculty at Oberlin College in Ohio.
