My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Soon our diocese will take up a collection for the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC). Please prayerfully consider supporting the collection this year. Half of the collected funds stay right here in the Diocese of Charleston, and the other half supports the collective communication work of the bishops and other national projects in the United States and around the world.

Radio Pio XII is one of the oldest Catholic radio stations in Bolivia, founded in 1959 by priests of the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate near the tin mines at Siglo XX. Rooted in the Gospel and in solidarity with Indigenous people and others who are poor and marginalized, Radio Pio XII expanded its reach by adding two more stations in the early 2000s.

One of those stations, in Cochabamba, reaches out to the nearby community with programming in both Spanish and the Quechua language of the local Indigenous people. With an emphasis on discussing human rights for marginalized people in the context of the Church and Catholic social action, the programming gives voice to those on the margins. But for that voice to be heard, Radio Pio XII needed to replace outdated transmission equipment. With help from the CCC, Radio Pio XII was able to make the necessary upgrades to its FM radio transmitter and editing equipment that will extend its reach and bring the Gospel to a wider audience.

Your support for the CCC helps the Church to modernize how it communicates the joy of the Gospel in developing nations worldwide. Not only does it help spread the Gospel, but it also helps form young disciples and gives them the practical skills they need to navigate today's digital media environment. Of the seven parishioners ([www.stjosephcolumbia.org/organ-committee-page](http://www.stjosephcolumbia.org/organ-committee-page)) who answered the call to serve on an investigative committee regarding the possibility of a new or refurbished pipe organ, almost zero/nada/none knew anything about a pipe organ. The first order of business was to educate, educate, educate. Committee members devoured numerous informative articles which you may read on our website ([www.stjosephcolumbia.org/organ-education-resources](http://www.stjosephcolumbia.org/organ-education-resources)). Many meetings were held over the course of several weeks, and our committee members' knowledge base grew slowly but surely.

Some questions we needed to answer before presenting any proposals to parish leadership: Should we rebuild what we have? Was the old organ adequate? If it was not adequate, can we add new voices to the old ones? Is the old organ a noteworthy instrument? What might a new pipe organ look like? Who would build it? How long would it take to build a pipe organ? How much would it cost? How long will it last? How do we discern God's will regarding this possible project? We'll break down these questions beginning next week! – Brad Cunningham

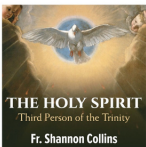
### Pentecost | Sacred Art
