

Readers of From the Organ Bench will remember we talked about the singing at Pat Zimmerman's Funeral Mass, and how I had never heard singing like that before at St. Joseph. Many of you suggested that maybe it was because half of those in attendance for the Funeral Mass were from Camden, Father Zimmerman's parish church. So, I did some under-cover reconnaissance at Camden Sunday, Aug. 8. I arrived early and entered the church incognito, hoping to throw off my scent as the church organist from St. Joseph. I already suspected what I would find, and my suspicions were confirmed. Their singing is pretty much like ours, better than most Catholic parishes! The Camden folks were *not* the reason for the more over-the-top-than-usual singing at the Funeral Mass. Hold that thought.

Sunday, Aug. 1, St. Joseph 10:30 AM Mass, that same robust, over-the-top-singing, happened again. "Unbelievable! What is going on?" I thought to myself through the entire Mass. Following the postlude, the truth was revealed. There, kneeling in their pew, reflecting after the closing hymn and postlude, was an entire row of seminarians. It all began to make sense. The Zimmerman Funeral Mass had been attended by no fewer than 10 priests – men who were not afraid to sing aLOUD to their Creator and make a joyful noise! Too, the Aug. 1 singing was bolstered by the seminarians who were visiting St. Joseph that Sunday morning.

MUSICAM SACRUM

Evolution of Sacred Music: Sacred Music Today

To read previous articles click here or visit https://www.stjosephcolumbia.org/davids-blog Since the Second Vatican Council published Sacrosanctum Concilium (Constitution on The Sacred Liturgy) in 1963, there has been much discussion and research among scholars and clergy aimed at setting the standard for sacred music in a post-Vatican II era. The council specifies "..there must be no innovations unless the good of the Church genuinely and certainly requires them; and care must be taken that any new forms adopted should in some way grow organically from forms already existing." In practical application of Sacrosanctum Concilium the sacred liturgy is to remain consistent and not adopt changes that are not in accord with the history of the Church. Sacred Music's primary function is to accompany liturgical action and it must do so with intrinsic beauty and sanctity. Pope Benedict XVI stated, "The People of God assembled for the liturgy sing the praises of God. In the course of her two-thousand-year history, the Church has created, and still creates, music and songs which represent a rich patrimony of faith and love. This heritage must not be lost." The rich history of Gregorian chant, polyphony, and the evolution of sacred music present us with a perfect model for sacred music.

Here at St. Joseph, we should be proud of our liturgical celebrations. The celebration of sacred liturgy in the vernacular is accompanied by the worshiping body singing hymns together in praise, cantors singing the sacred chants, the Schola cantorum (choir) employing historical polyophy of the church, and our congregation singing some Latin hymns! All of these elements are what is asked of us by the Church!

Over the next few weeks we will begin our next series "Sacred Music Myths: Debunked." The goal of this next series is to address some of the common questions—or in some cases misunderstandings—of sacred music. I hope I can shed some light on some of these interesting topics.



In view of questions that may be raised by the passage of the new South Carolina **Open Carry with Training Act** that goes into effect on Aug. 15, 2021, this is to confirm that the act does not alter the prohibition against concealable weapons on school campuses, except by law enforcement and in certain other very limited circumstances.

SLED representatives have also confirmed that neither does the act alter South Carolina law providing that concealable weapons are prohibited on church campuses without the express permission of the church official with such authority. In the case of diocesan church property, such weapons may only be allowed in compliance with diocesan policy, which may be found here: <u>Safety, Security and Weapons Policy for the Roman Catholic Diocese of Charleston</u>.

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The nation of Afghanistan is in the midst of a critical emergency. The state take-over of the lawful Afghani government by the insurrectionist Taliban forces poses a threat to global security and has led to a widespread humanitarian crisis. I cannot adequately express the seriousness of the situation. Foreign nationals are making life or death decisions in absolute desperation. We have seen the images and videos coming out of the country, and they are nearly impossible to watch.

Thousands of people who have worked as interpreters, translators, and in other capacities alongside American military over the past 20 years now find themselves and their families in danger. The United States is currently evacuating diplomats and other government employees and has authorized use of the Emergency Refugee and Migration Assistance Fund for meeting the urgent needs of Afghan refugees and Special Immigrant Visa (SIV) applicants. Staff from the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, Catholic Charities USA, and other partners have been at Fort Lee, Va., for the past few weeks to assist the federal resettlement of SIV applicants and their families. I urge government and military officials to continue coordinating strategic plans to assist the citizens of Afghanistan, especially the most vulnerable and at-risk.

This situation demands attention and prayer. As Catholic faithful, I ask for your prayers for our brothers and sisters in this time of crisis. Their lives are being threatened at this very moment. Together let us pray:

Almighty and merciful God, we ask that you create peace in our world and to keep the devastation of war far from innocent lives. We ask for your mercy for all victims of terrorist attacks this week in Afghanistan and throughout the world. Be with those who are suffering and wrap them in the mantle of your divine mercy to find solace in you. We ask for the powerful intercession of Mary, our mother and consoler, of St. Joseph, the mighty defender of the Church, and of all the angels and saints, that they may intercede for a world torn apart by evil, that peace be restored and the defenseless of the Middle East be protected. +In the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.
