FROM THE ORGAN BENCH NO. 8 OF 14

Go to www.stjosephcolumbia.org/sacred-music-ministry for From the Organ Bench Articles 1-7.

Answers to questions were needed before the organ committee could take a proposal to Msgr. Harris and the finance council e.g. "Who would build a new organ? What might a new pipe organ look like? How long would it take to build a pipe organ? How much would it cost? How do we discern God's will regarding this possible project? Who might build a new organ for St. Joseph?"

Organ committee members Ashley Darnall, Dr. Michael Dickson, Kathy and Howard Ellstrom, Tawfig Hodaly, and Carol and Jed Shropshire visited seven installations of four organ companies. They travelled to Augusta, Ga., Williamsburg and Richmond, Va., and Buffalo, NY. You are invited to visit the parish website Sacred Music Ministry>Organ Project for more detailed information and to see pictures of those instruments inspected. I visited one additional instrument in Atlanta of a fifth different builder at the height of the pandemic when it was not safe for everyone to go. After much discernment and discussion, three out of five potential builders were eliminated for various reasons. The other two potential builders were invited to visit Columbia. Because of our over-the-top experience visiting the St. James Episcopal Church in Richmond

[https://doers.org/music/our-organ/] and because of the firm's total professional approach when meeting with us in Columbia, the committee unanimously chose C.B. Fisk Organ Builders of Gloucester, Mass. as our best choice for builder if/when the time came to build a new organ. This decision was announced to Msgr. Harris Jan. 15, 2022.

Drawing Strength from Our Lady of Sorrows by Kimberly Hahn






Our Lady of Sorrows and the Power of Prayer



St. Joseph Basketball Registration OPEN

CYBL Basketball League - Grades 2-12

8th-12th grade teams' official season is expected to start early November.

2nd-7th grade teams' official season is expected to start early December.

Registration is open through October 13, 2023.

Teams that are formed may start practicing as early as mid-October. Late registration will only be accepted if there are openings on existing teams.

League Teams are:

2nd/3rd grades

4th/5th grades

6th/7th grades

8th/9th grades

10th/11th/12th grades

- Teams will be capped at 10 players per team. We may be able to add players to 12 if the league approves.
- Teams will consist of St. Joseph Church parishioner families and St. Joseph School families. We can accept a limited number of children from the community. Teams will have no more than 3 community children per team. Priority will be given to parish and school families.
- 9th-12th graders: For those students trying out for high school teams, we understand that the tryout schedules start after registration closes. For those students wanting to secure a spot in the league, we recommend registering. Please note that registration is refundable, minus \$10.00 processing fee. After October 20, the refund fee is increased to \$55.00.

Keeping Children and Teens SAFE ONLINE

Computers and mobile devices can be helpful tools for children and teens to learn and grow in faith and fellowship. Unfortunately, the digital world is also full of unsafe and explicit content. You wouldn't hand a teen the car keys without first teaching them how to drive. The same should be true for using technology—teach them how to keep themselves and others safe while using it.

You can use the following tips to better protect young people from harm online:

- Model appropriate online behavior for young people. Children look to their parents to teach and show them the ways to appropriately use technology. The biggest influence on what children see as acceptable or unacceptable is you.
- 2 Teach your children not to share private information or images online. Strangers posing as online friends can try to gain the trust of minors. Personal information such as name, address, and phone number should never be shared with an unknown person. Tell your children to immediately tell a trusted adult if anyone makes them feel uncomfortable.
- 3 Limit usage of computers and mobile devices to public spaces in the home. Not only will this help to prevent young people from accessing unsafe websites, it will also help them to develop safe browsing habits later in life.
- Install software that can block or monitor explicit website use. Open access to harmful websites, like those that include pornography, is a constant threat to



young people. Website filters can prevent access to harmful and explicit sites and some can even alert you when such a site is accessed.

- Review and discuss the websites your child has visited and apps they have used. Oversight of your child or teen's browsing history and app usage can help to keep them safe online. If you notice your child has browsed an unsafe website or app, discuss why that behavior is harmful. Learn about current apps that could be harmful to children and teenagers, especially those that involve image sharing, private communication, or the illusion of privacy.
- Report online exploitation of minors to public authorities. If you become aware of explicit content involving minors, such as solicitation, explicit images or videos, you should submit a report to law enforcement or through resources like CyberTipline from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.
