HEARING LOOP IN THE SANCTUARY:

The 12:15 PM Mass this Sunday, June 11, will conclude with Exposition, Procession and Benediction, in celebration of the Feast of Corpus Christi.



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As your bishop, it is my responsibility to oversee the formation of the men who have answered God's call to enter the seminary. This includes funding their education, housing, and training needs for 6-10 years of formation. On Sunday, June 11, we will take up our Annual Seminary Collection to help in the support of the 17 men who are studying to be priests for our diocese. This collection, along with the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina (formerly the BAA) are the primary sources of revenue for the seminarians. By supporting their formation process, you are helping them to prepare spiritually, morally, and pastorally to shepherd in Christ's name.

In addition to your financial support, I urge you to pray for more young men to respond to God's call to the priesthood as our needs continue to increase with the growing Catholic population of our state. Keeping in mind Jesus' own works that "the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few" (Lk 10:2), I ask all our people in the diocese to offer encouragement to young men to consider the priesthood and for young women to consider the call to religious life.

Thank you for your generosity in providing for the future shepherds of our flock. Please be assured of my prayers for you.

This Weekend - Second Collection (6/10-11) - Seminary Collection

- The diocese currently has 20 seminarians for the 2023-24 academic year.
- Of the 20, 5 are college seminarians, 3 are pre-theologians, and 12 are theologians.
- Seminary formation can take anywhere from 6-10 years of formation depending on the person.
- We currently have seminarians in Latrobe, PA, Boynton Beach, FL, Miami, FL, and Washington, DC.
- We ordained one priest this year and 2 transitional deacons.
 The average cost to the diocese per seminarian per year is
- The primary sources of revenue to form seminarians comes from the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina (formerly the BAA) and the seminarian collection for this weekend.
 However, those sources of revenue have not kept pace with increasing number of seminarians and associated costs.



A recent Pew Forum survey revealed the startling statistic that 69% of Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. For the majority of Catholics today, the Eucharist is merely a symbol of Christ, and the Mass is merely a collectivity of like-minded individuals gathering to remember his life.

This indicates a spiritual disaster, for the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life." In response to this crisis, Bishop Robert Barron, then the Chair of the Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, began working with his brother bishops on a solution. From these conversations, the National Eucharistic Revival was born.

This Is My Body: A Call to Eucharistic Revival is designed to accompany that revival. In this brief but illuminating text, Bishop Barron offers a threefold analysis of the Eucharist as sacred meal, sacrifice, and Real Presence, helping readers to understand the sacrament of Jesus' Body and Blood more thoroughly so that they might fall in love with him more completely.

FROM THE ORGAN BENCH NO. 7 OF 14

We learned last week that all pipe organs with electro-pneumatic key action fail and must be rebuilt or replaced every 30-40 years. Our 1949 electro-pneumatic Möller organ began failing in the late 1970s. Under the leadership of Fthr. Creston Tawes, parishioner Zane Knauss, and Margaret Jackson, organist-choir director, after intensive research evidenced by records still on file, a proposal was put forward in 1979 to build a mechanical (tracker) action organ that would last the life of the church building. For many reasons, including the failing health of Fthr. Tawes who died August 8, 1980, and ensuing pastoral and music personnel changes, this project was not forthcoming. Instead, the old organ was rebuilt and enlarged in 1980-81. The rebuilt and enlarged 1981 Möller organ began failing again in 2007 before it met its demise in 2009.

While it is true a new electro-pneumatic action pipe organ is less expensive than a new mechanical (tracker) action organ, in the long run, it is much more expensive because it must be replaced or rebuilt every 30-40 years. Our committee believed it was the most fiscally responsible decision to build a noteworthy pipe organ with mechanical action that would last the lifetime of the church, thereby avoiding kicking the can down the road to future St. Joseph parishioners. Instead of rebuilding or replacing the organ every 30 years, a mechanical action organ only needs to be reregulated (tightened up) every 50 years. By noteworthy, it is meant an instrument of grandeur, beauty, and variety of voices like no other organ in Columbia or South Carolina. Pray for God's blessing!


