#### Dear St. Joseph Parishioners,

I pray this letter finds you well and filled with the peace of Christ. This past year has been a grace-filled time for our parish family. The dedication of our newly completed dome was not only a beautiful celebration but also a reminder of how, together, we can build something that lifts our hearts to God and reflects the beauty of our Catholic faith.

Fiscal transparency and good stewardship remain central to our mission at St. Joseph. I am grateful to our Finance Council for their dedicated leadership in helping administer the temporal goods of our parish. Their wise counsel allows us to continue planning responsibly for the future while meeting the needs of the present.


We have been reporting regularly on the progress of our organ fundraising. As a reminder, the organ fund was first established under Msgr. Rowland, when the need for a new organ was first identified. The numbers we have shared include both money already received and pledges that parishioners have committed to give. Out of love for our parish, many families pledged generously; however, some have since needed to withdraw their commitments due to financial circumstances. We are deeply grateful for both the pledges made and the honesty with which these changes were shared.

Through your generosity, we have already received \$1,962,986.00 in gifts and active pledges toward our goal of \$2,250,000.00. We now stand just shy of \$300,000.00 from making this vision a reality. With a letter of intent signed with Mascioni and the organ design complete, we are ready for the next step: signing the official build contract in March 2026. To do so, we must secure the remaining funds. We invite you to prayerfully consider how you might help us cross this final threshold. Together, with faith, perseverance, and trust in God's providence, we can bring this instrument of beauty and worship to life for generations to come.

Our fiscal year runs from July 1 through June 30. As the pie chart illustrates, half of our funding comes from the weekly offertory, a testimony to your consistent generosity. The next largest portion comes from Other Funded Sources—including donations for St. Vincent de Paul, the Bishop's Annual Appeal, our four scholarships, the special education program we hope to launch shortly, senior life, and major projects such as the dome and the organ.

For 2024–2025, our income reflected a significant surplus. However, this number is not a true reflection of ordinary operating revenue. Much of this surplus came from the fundraising for the dome and organ. Once this money is accounted for, the surplus this year was \$111,000.00. This is considerably higher

than years past, as we build our yearly budgets to balance income and expenses. Due to the incredible generosity of the parish, we have these extra funds. The Finance Council voted to have this money put directly into the organ project to get us closer to our goal.



Guided by a shared commitment to sustainability, the Finance Council and I balance present needs with future planning. Our shared priority is ensuring that the facilities and programs we steward today can be responsibly maintained tomorrow. Through careful planning and due diligence, we have been able to set aside savings to support future day-to-day expenses, safeguarding the vitality of our parish for years to come.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, Before returning to the Lord, our beloved Pope Francis chose the motto for World Mission Sunday 2025: Missionaries of Hope Among All People. This motto reminds each of us as Christians, and the entire Church, of our fundamental vocation to be messengers and builders of hope.

Hope for our world is the ever-present person, Jesus Christ. He was sent by the Father to bring life to a world filled with sin and death. While beautiful, the tree has become a safety hazard—its brittle limbs frequently fall, even in mild weather, posing risks to people, property, and walkways. With full approval from the City of Columbia, we are moving forward with this necessary step. In its place, we'll plant two Japanese Pistache trees—known for their vibrant fall color, low maintenance, and resilience. You may recognize them from our Rose Garden and MAB parking lot.


