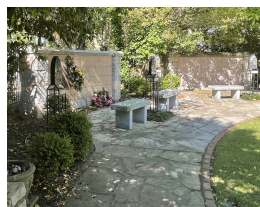

LENT

OUR JOURNEY THROUGH LENT

As Catholics, we believe that our faith in Jesus Christ and our love for Him finds expression in the way we live our lives, to be included in the things we do. To fulfill the Great Commandment (You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.... You shall love your neighbor as yourself.) the Church recommends that we undertake what are called the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy are these:

- To admonish the sinner
- To instruct the ignorant
- To counsel the doubtful
- To comfort the afflicted
- To bear wrongs patiently
- To pray for the living and dead
- To forgive offenses willingly

The Corporal Works of Mercy are these:

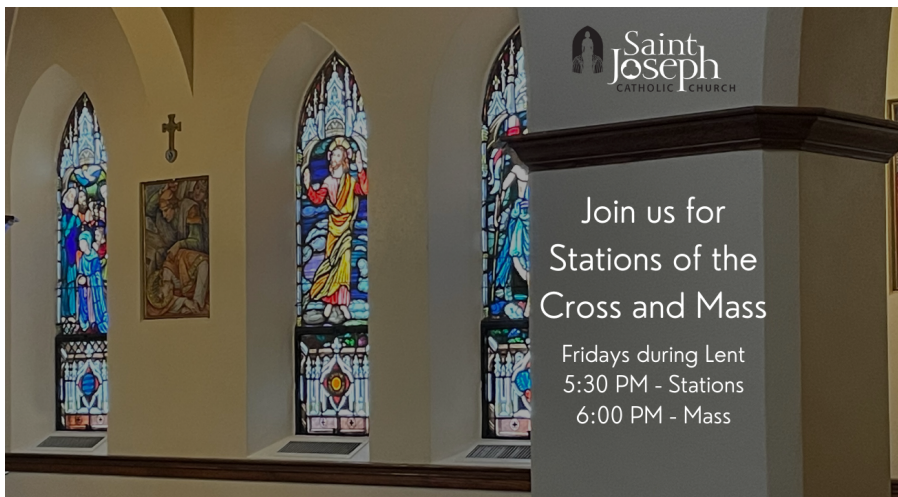
- To feed the hungry
- To give drink to the thirsty
- To clothe the naked
- To visit the imprisoned
- To shelter the homeless
- To visit the sick
- To bury the dead

Please consider ways in which you can perform Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy for those in need. Lent originally was called "Quadragesima" (Latin for "forty") standing for forty days of fasting required of Christians before Easter Sunday. Early English (Anglo Saxon) changed the name of these 40 days to "Lencten" (now called "Lent") which means "Spring." Lectentid was Anglo Saxon for the month of March, "when days lengthen" (are longer).

- ALL FRIDAYS of LENT are days of abstinence. Meat and poultry (i.e. warm-blooded animals) should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.
- GOOD FRIDAY is a day of fasting and abstinence. On this day, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together should not equal

another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.

During Lent, the following things are not allowed: the Gloria (Glory to God in the Highest), the "Alleluia," Baptisms, Weddings (except in special emergencies), and flowers on the altars.



LENTEN BURDEN BOX

A locked wooden box will, once again, be placed at the St. Joseph Altar, beginning on Ash Wednesday. Please write down your personal burdens, concerns, prayers and/or petitions that you would like to offer to God during the Lenten Season and place them in the box. All of these will be kept strictly confidential. On Holy Saturday night we will use the "burdens" to fuel our Easter fire.

40 YEARS OF SERVICE TO ST. JOSEPH'S AND COLUMBIA

Annual Report:

Inspired by Gospel values, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, a Catholic lay organization, leads women and men to join together to grow spiritually - offering person-to-person service to those who are needy and suffering. At St. Joseph's, our primary mission is to feed the hungry of our community through our food pantry located in the basement of the church. Monetary donations through church envelopes, and the 5 SVdP boxes located in the church, together with your food donations (from food drives and the "I Care I Share" food collections on the first Sunday of each month) allowed us to **feed 5031 (an increase of 16%) families** last year **feeding a total of 11982 (an increase of 13%) people** - a record number of people helped. 826 of these families helped were through home visits.

Low food costs allow us to offer other forms of assistance, such as utility assistance. Every request for assistance is based on the availability of funds and other factors agreed upon by our members. In 2023, we were able to help **323 families with assistance for a total of \$72,890**. In total, our St. Vincent de Paul conference spent \$117,324 in 2023. It is because of the generous support of you, our parishioners, and the support of Msgr. Harris that we are able to do what we do.

Meetings are on the second Tuesday of each month at 7 PM in the Ministries and Administration building. We welcome new members at all times. As our membership is aging, we particularly need younger members and ask that you prayerfully consider giving of your time.

The helpline number is 803.799.0761. The message states the times our pantry is open and when we take utility requests. The standard time for utility requests is the second Tuesday of each month between 5:45-6:30 PM. We have also initiated an email address where clients can request assistance. That email address is SVDP1948@gmail.com if any parishioner would like to request assistance. Parishioners may also call the church office at 803.254.7646 for assistance in getting in touch with a Vincentian. The pantry is open every Wednesday from 8:30-11:30 AM. In closing, we encourage parishioners to avail themselves of our services. We assure you that all assistance is handled with discretion and you need not fear requests being made public. Parishioners receive priority consideration when requesting assistance.

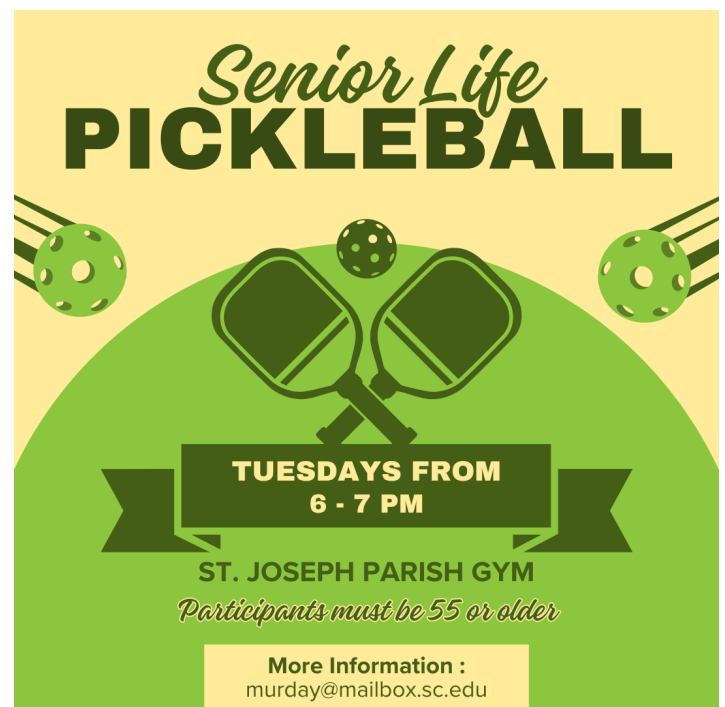
