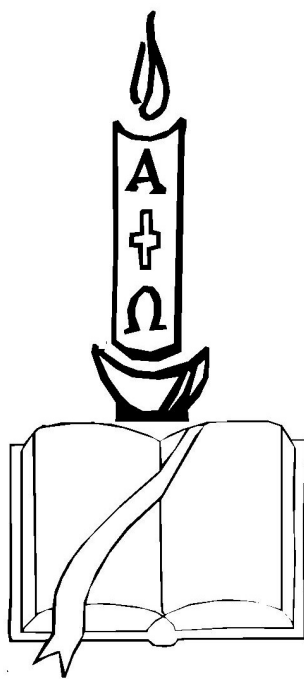

But they are in peace.*

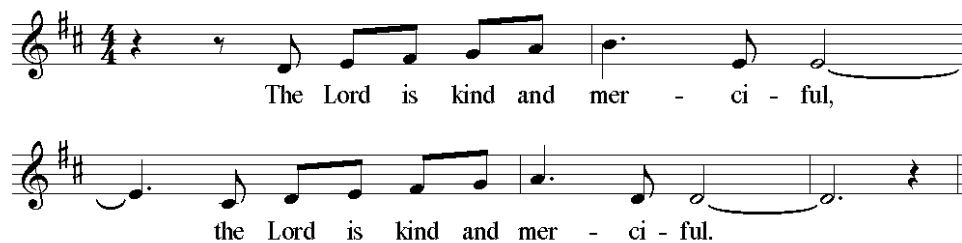
*For if to others, indeed, they seem punished,
