Upcoming Second Collection (10/21-22) World Mission Sunday



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

World Mission Sunday will be celebrated on Sunday, Oct. 22, and Pope Francis asks all of us to focus not on the country in which we live, but on the mission fields of our world. Why? Because there are 258,540 religious sisters laboring there; 844,000 catechists teaching the faith to the world's villages; 38,140 seminarians studying for the priesthood; 8,750 shelters serving the homeless; and 26 million children receiving necessary assistance.

Pope Francis has sent a call to each of us to go into our world and proclaim the presence of Christ, to make his love visible and real through missionary work that reaches to the ends of the earth. He said all of us "can contribute to this missionary movement with our prayers and activities, with material offerings and the offering of our sufferings, and our personal witness.

"Just as the two disciples of Emmaus told the others what had taken place along the way (cf. Lk 24:35), so too our proclamation will be a joyful telling of Christ the Lord, his life, his passion, his death and resurrection, and the wonders that his love has accomplished in our lives," the pope said.

Missio ad Gentes, the Vatican II document on the missionary nature of the Church, reminds us that the Church of Christ is a missionary Church, that the human family has a right to hear the good news of peace and salvation, and our God is Emmanuel. The Pontifical Societies for the Propagation of the Faith has the primary responsibility for the Church's missionary work. In the Diocese of Charleston, it is under the leadership of Rev. Msgr. Edward D. Lofton, director, and Helena Moniz, associate director. The office is available to assist each of you. I thank you for the generous support you give to the Church's missions.

FROM THE ORGAN BENCH NO. 12 OF 14

How long does it take to install a pipe organ in a church?

Before a pipe organ is installed in a church, it is set up in the builder's erecting room. Afterward, the organ is dismantled, carefully packed, and loaded onto tractor-trailers. Upon arrival, parishioners, young and old, are waiting at the church to help unload the trucks. We are told it is a day of rejoicing, thankfulness, and grand excitement. It then takes about three weeks to install the organ.

After the organ is installed and we have returned to the church, each single pipe must be meticulously voiced. Voicing is the process of fine-tuning every note of every rank of pipe, one by one, so that it fits the room's acoustics perfectly. During this time, we

will continue to use our electronic organ. The organist of Holy Name of Jesus Cathedral in Raleigh told me that they used an electronic organ after the new cathedral was opened for worship while their new Fisk organ was being made. It was decided to not tell parishioners on which weekend the new organ would first be played. When that weekend arrived, the electronic organ was used to perform the prelude but on the processional hymn the new pipe organ began playing. The organist said that more than 1,000 people turned around with their jaws on the floor. I pray we can have that same experience one day. St. Joseph, pray for us!
