

# LENT AT ST. JOSEPH

As Catholics, we believe our faith in Jesus Christ and our love for Him are expressed through how we live. To fulfill the Great Commandment —to love God with all our heart, soul, and mind, and to love our neighbor as ourselves—the Church encourages us to practice the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy are:

- To admonish the sinner
- To instruct the ignorant
- To counsel the doubtful
- To comfort the afflicted
- To bear wrongs patiently
- To pray for the living and dead
- To forgive offenses willingly


The Corporal Works of Mercy are:

- To feed the hungry
- To give drink to the thirsty
- To clothe the naked
- To visit the imprisoned
- To shelter the homeless
- To visit the sick
- To bury the dead

Please consider ways to practice the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy during Lent. Lent, originally called Quadragesima ("forty"), recalls the forty days of fasting before Easter. The word Lent comes from an Old English term meaning "spring," when days grow longer. All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence: Catholics age 14 and older should not eat meat or poultry on these days.

GOOD FRIDAY is a day of fasting and abstinence. On this day, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year. Not Permitted in Church During Lent

The following things are not allowed: the Gloria (Glory to God in the Highest), the "Alleluia," Baptisms, Weddings (except in special emergencies), and flowers on the altars.



# ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence. Catholics ages 18–59 may eat one full meal and two smaller meals (no eating between meals). All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat and poultry for Catholics age 14 and older.

*Those attending the 7:30 AM Mass should not park on Devine Street due to school carpool. The school parking lot will be available only for the 6 PM Mass. Drive-thru distribution will be available from 3:30–4:30 PM under the Ministries & Administration Building overhang for those who viewed the livestream; traffic cones will direct vehicles.*



## NEW ART & DEDICATION



We are delighted to highlight the latest addition to our parish's art collection - a beautiful piece inspired by Saint Carlo Acutis created by Angel Allen, a longtime member of our St. Joseph parish.

Angel's work is featured throughout our campus, including the Stations of the Cross in the Rose Columbarium Garden and the Holy Family Mosaic Sculpture near the church. Her works reflect her artistic vision and commitment to community, life's beauty, and sacred mystery through color, glass, and mosaic design.

Saint Carlo Acutis, canonized in 2025, is known as the first millennial saint and a powerful example for young Catholics today. Carlo used his gifts in technology to document and share Eucharistic miracles from around the world, and he lived out his faith with joy, humility, and devotion until his death at age 15. His life reminds us that holiness can be lived in everyday life through prayer, generosity, and using our talents to glorify God.

The dedication of this piece will take place on **Sunday, March 15, at 5:00 PM, outside of the Blossom House**, where the piece is displayed. This is a Youth Ministry event, and all parishioners are welcome to join them in this blessing and celebration. We hope this artwork and the life of Saint Carlo Acutis will be an inspiration to our youth and to all who encounter it.


