

HEARING LOOP IN THE SANCTUARY:

YEAR 1: PROCLAIM THE FAITH

Year of Evangelization

Heavenly Father, as we journey along the faithful way, may we be so full of your love that we draw others to you, to the Way, the Truth and the Life.

> As you walk beside us, may we support one another in prayer and humble service.

> Open our pilgrim hearts so we might joyfully proclaim your message of hope.

In this *Year of Evangelization*, let us keep our eyes ever fixed on you.

We ask this in the mighty name of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, and through the power of your Holy Spirit.

Amen.

MONTH OF MARCH:

Pray that the Holy Spirit will put an individual on your heart to whom you can proclaim the Good News of salvation in Christ. Do so at least once.

OUR JOURNEY THROUGH LENT

As Catholics, we believe that our faith in Jesus Christ and our love for Him finds expression in the way we live our lives, to be included in the things we do. To fulfill the Great Commandment (You shall love the Lord, your God, will all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.... You shall love your neighbor as yourself.) the Church recommends that we undertake what are called the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy.

The Spiritual Works of Mercy are these:

- To admonish the sinner
- To instruct the ignorant
- To counsel the doubtful
- To comfort the afflicted
- To bear wrongs patiently
- To pray for the living and dead
- To forgive offenses willingly

The Corporal Works of Mercy are these:

- To feed the hungry
- To give drink to the thirsty
- To clothe the naked
- To visit the imprisoned
- To shelter the homeless
- To visit the sick
- To bury the dead

Please consider ways in which you can perform Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy for those in need. Lent originally was called "Quadragesima" (Latin for "forty") standing for forty days of fasting required of Christians before Easter Sunday. Early English (Anglo Saxon) changed the name of these 40 days to "Lencten" (now called "Lent") which means "Spring." Lectentid was Anglo Saxon for the month of March, "when days lengthen" (are longer).

- ALL FRIDAYS of LENT are days of abstinence. Meat and poultry (i.e. warm- blooded animals) should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.
- GOOD FRIDAY is a day of fasting and abstinence. On this day, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together should not equal

another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.

Not Permitted in Church During Lent: The following things are not allowed: the Gloria (Glory to God in the Highest), the "Alleluia," Baptisms, Weddings (except in special emergencies), and flowers on the altars.



LENTEN BURDEN BOX

A locked wooden box will be placed at the St. Joseph Altar starting Ash Wednesday. Write down your burdens, prayers, or petitions for the Lenten season and place them in the box. All submissions will remain confidential. On Holy Saturday night, we will use these "burdens" to fuel our Easter fire.





The church and sanctuary will be closed for acoustical testing on Monday, March 17.








Luker-Meyer Scholarship

The Luker-Meyer Scholarship Fund, established in honor of Dr. and Mrs. Luker's parents, offers up to 50% tuition scholarships for children from our parish. This \$25,000 annual fund supports families seeking a Catholic education at St. Joseph School. The scholarship is renewable each year, provided the child maintains satisfactory academic performance and the family meets need-based criteria through FACTS and the Tuition Parishioner Discount agreement.

Applicants must be active, practicing Catholics at St. Joseph Church. Families with children in grades K-6 are eligible to apply, with separate applications required for each child. Recipients are also invited to attend a back-to-school luncheon with Msgr. Harris and Dr. & Mrs. Luker.

Ranson-Able Scholarship

In memory of William (Bill) F. Ranson III, Ph.D., a Professor of Mechanical Engineering who valued education, especially Catholic education, as a foundation for moral and academic growth. This annual scholarship fund will offer up to 50% in scholarships to eligible students of St. Joseph Catholic School, offering families with limited means the opportunity for a Catholic education. Qualifications: This scholarship is for the 2025-2026 academic year, open to students in 4K through 6th grade at St. Joseph School. Families must be active, registered, contributing members of St. Joseph Church and meet financial need, demonstrated through the FACTS process. A completed Tuition Parishioner Discount Agreement is also required. Scholarships may be received annually.


